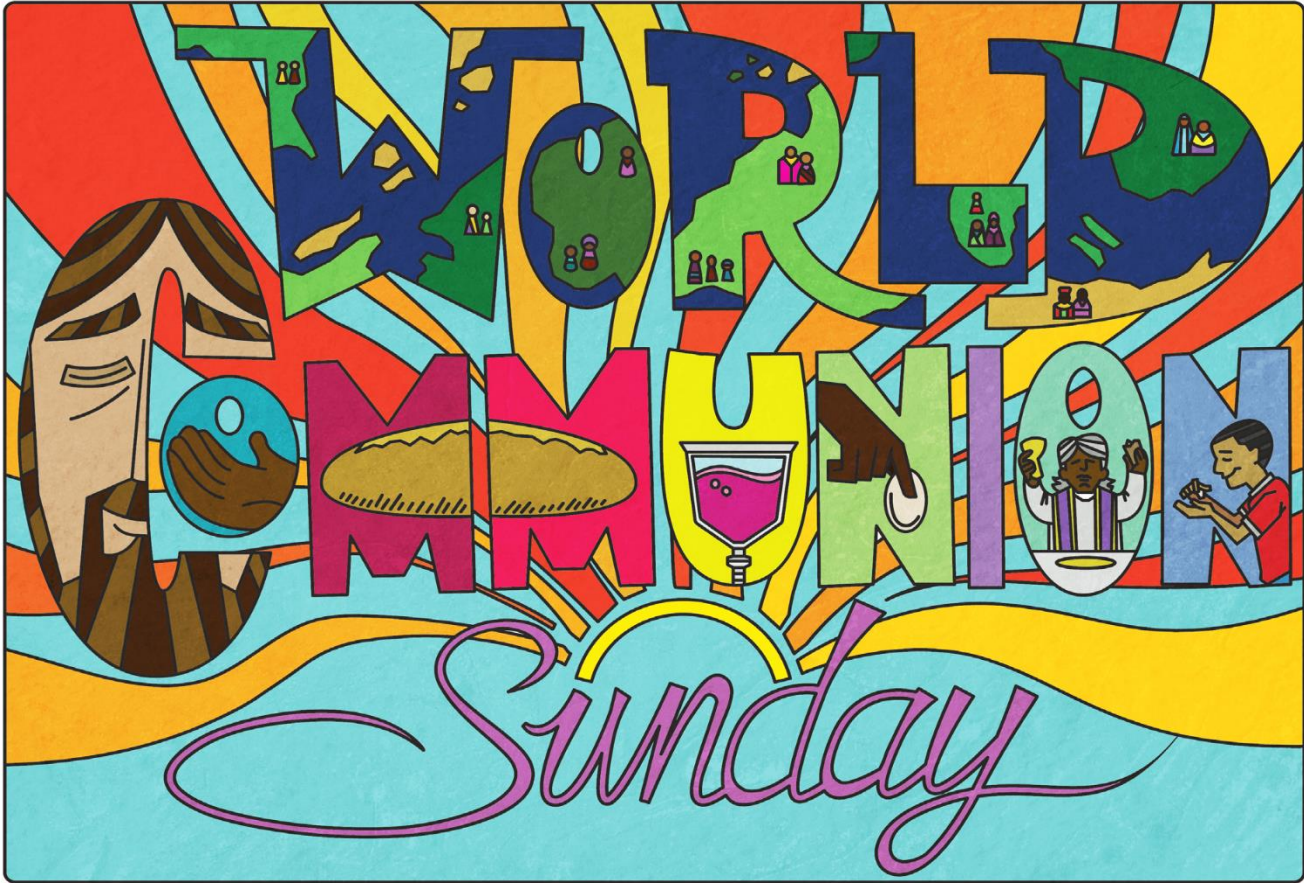

World Communion Sunday is celebrated every year on the first Sunday in October. Originally called World Wide Communion Sunday, it is a gift of the Presbyterian Church to the larger ecumenical faith community. The first celebration took place in 1933 at Shadyside Presbyterian Church in Pittsburgh, PA where The Rev. Dr. Hugh Thompson Kerr served as pastor. Dr. Kerr conceived the notion of World Communion Sunday during his service as Moderator of the General Assembly in 1930 and brought the idea back to Shadyside. Dr. Kerr’s vision caught on and became an effort of the church’s Division of Stewardship to bring churches together in a service of Christian unity. The celebration of World Wide Communion Sunday was adopted as a denominational practice in the Presbyterian Church (US) in 1936 and the invitation to other churches across the U.S. and around the world has been extended ever since. Today, World Communion Sunday is celebrated as an ecumenical event around the world as a witness to our connection to one another in Christ and a call to serve together.

On this World Communion Sunday, we recognize and celebrate that while we may gather at different churches, and come from different traditions, and even live worlds apart, we are still one family bound up together in the love of Christ. As one family we are called to proclaim our unity in Christ in the midst of a divided world, sharing what we have with each other, caring for one another, and being in relationship even as we celebrate our differences. Jesus tells us that every time we come to his table, eat the bread, and drink from the cup, we do not come alone, but come with sisters and brothers everyone. In this simple meal, we get a taste and a glimpse of the Heavenly banquet where all will be at one table together in the Kingdom of God. Come, let us taste and see that God is good!
