All Saints Sunday

A word about All Saints Sunday as you prepare for worship:
Today is a day to rejoice and give thanks for all those who through the ages have faithfully served the Lord, those faithful men, women, and children who have helped others to know and love God. In our Presbyterian and Reformed tradition, rather than putting saints on pedestals as holy people set apart in glory, we give glory to God for the ordinary, holy lives of the believers of this and every age. As we share in the Lord’s Supper today, we will give thanks for the saints we have known, especially those who have died, and we will pray that we may be counted among them. If you have not already done so, you may write the name of a saint you would like to remember and honor on one of the leaves scattered among the pews. You may make as many as you like. These will be collected and lifted up with thanksgiving during the communion prayer.

*O Lord, give us faith to look beyond touch and sight,
and seeing that we are surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses,
let us run with perseverance the race that is set before us,
looking to Jesus, the pioneer and perfecter of our faith. Amen.*

Lift up your hearts. **We lift them to the Lord.**
Let us give thanks to the Lord our God. **It is right to give our thanks and praise.**

Thanks and praise to you, O God, creator and lover of the universe.... Remembering that we are not alone at this table, we join our voices with all the saints whom you have called, who forever sing your praise:

Holy, holy, holy Lord, God of power and might, heaven and earth are full of your glory. Hosanna in the highest! Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord. Hosanna in the highest, hosanna in the highest.

We give you thanks for Jesus Christ, our host and our guest at this table.... With thanksgiving, we take this bread and this cup, gifts of the earth through which you bless us, and we offer ourselves in your service. Great is the faith we proclaim:

Christ has died, Christ is risen, Christ will come again.

Pour out your Holy Spirit upon us, O God.... Gathered at your table, we join all your saints who have gone on before us and remember them before you:
As the names of saints are read, let us give thanks for them and for those whose names we cannot speak.

As our Savior Christ has taught us, we are bold to pray:

Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name, thy kingdom come, thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread; and forgive us our debts, as we forgive our debtors; and lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. For thine is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory, forever. Amen.

Communion of the People
During our celebration of Communion, please partake of the bread as you receive it and hold the cup until all are served so that we may drink together, signifying our unity in Christ.

Prayer after Communion (unison)
God of all glory, in this holy feast you have made us one with Christ and with that great multitude of the faithful—those who hunger and thirst no more and worship night and day in your temple. Lead us in paths of righteousness and guide us to the springs of the water of life, until we join the choir of all the redeemed, singing: Salvation belongs to our God who is seated on the throne, and to the Lamb: Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.
